With the sharp increase of grocery prices this year, shopping for food has become a source of tension and strain for many of us. Gasps can be heard at cash registers. Frustration seems to hang over the parking lot, a gathering fog of all of

Now completing their first school year, the brand new New Leaf Prep Academy located in Howard, Wisconsin is a K-8 Montessori & nature-based school on a mission to cultivate life-long, self-driven learners.




New Leaf Prep Academy is nature-oriented in its studies and includes raised bed gardens for every class. It is excited about current work on a new building and a "natural" outdoor space with a raised bed area and a greenhouse.

The school highly values good nutrition for their students and believes it affects how students perform. Not only does the curriculum for the classes include growing food, but also includes cooking classes, and teaches students skills such as pickling produce.

When asked what kinds of plants they grow, the response was "everything." They have found that the children tend to enjoy eating healthy foods and produce the more they are exposed to them and get to help in the growing and cooking processes.

The students enjoy eating all kinds of foods they bring in their cold lunch - even seaweed!





New Leaf Prep Academy was a recipient of three Garden Blitz raised garden beds during May of 2022, and has already been working on putting them to good use with their current summer camp students.
