2022 Garden Blitz Accomplishments

Totals: Garden installed in Green Bay since 2014: 880, 36 % of boxes are reduced fee boxes delivered to educational institutions or low income individuals or social agencies. 124 Total mentors 124 and 143 total mentees (new gardeners)!

To celebrate our 10th year in 2023 New Leaf Garden Blitz plans to build and install 80 more raised bed gardens throughout the community. We are dedicated to installing gardens for organizations that empower families of children in our most vulnerable populations.
