Food forestry has been increasing in popularity, and Green Bay local Tyler Delsart has proven that this sustainable trend is more than possible in Northeast Wisconsin with Tundra Grove. Often consisting of seven layers, a food forest is designed to produce an edible landscape that can promote sustainability and healthy eating.

Designed to create perennial food forests from frontier habitats, Tundra Grove brings the magic of food forests to the Green Bay area. Founded by Tyler Delsart, Tundra Grove is a “developing urban homestead that mimics forest ecology.”
